In the next election period, I would like to work on the following topics:

1. More reliability

2. Balance between online and offline tournaments

To me the future of Memory Sports lies in establishing a well weighted online and offline tournament structure. That goes not only for Memory League Competitions but also for the traditional format. Why is that? In times when climate change becomes a more pressing topic the IAM should also contribute to this by making the competitions more accessible to all people in the World while at the same time making it easier to take part without wasting personal and global resources. Furthermore, it also is a question of justice if only certain people can afford to visit events in person. Offline competitions are of course very important but integrating them into a bigger structure of hybrid tournaments would benefit the sport the most.

3. Fostering diversity

Unfortunately, our sport is not as diverse as it could be. As an IAM board member, I would like to focus on marginalized groups and make sure that their voices are heard. Diversity, equity, inclusion, and belonging should be represented on the board and taken into consideration in every decision.
